On Monday 18 April I visited Cambridge University for a Mathematics event for Year 12 Girls.

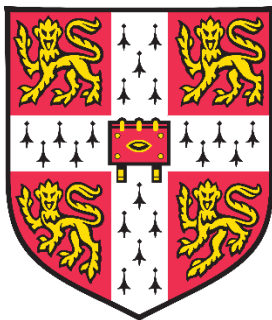
